

Information for incoming exchange students 2021/22

Application

Exchange students must be nominated by one of our partner universities and will then be sent an application form. Applicants must ensure they have a passport, their most recent transcript of results, an academic reference and their English language test results. They will also have to write a personal statement explaining why they wish to study at the School of Arts and Social Sciences.

When an application is successful the student will be issued with an acceptance letter, student number, supporting visa documentation, where applicable, and guidance for the next stage of admissions.

Module selection

Students will need to provisionally select their modules before arrival. Applicants will receive a list of available modules upon receipt of application. For specific information contact sass.exchanges@city.ac.uk.

Accommodation

There is limited accommodation for students coming to study for a single term. Students who intend to study for a single term can register their interest in accommodation by emailing study-abroad@city.ac.uk.

Assessment and grading

Courses are assessed by coursework and examination. A grade of 40% is required to pass a module.

During the first week of teaching you will be given the opportunity to decide if you would like to take your exams in the 'early exam period' or the later 'standard exam period', details of these dates are provided in the Key Dates section. The period you choose may impact your departure dates.

Is it possible to enrol onto modules from other faculties?	No, only modules within the School of Arts and Social Sciences are available.		
Departments	Economics, English, International Politics, Journalism, Music, Psychology, Sociology.		
Language of teaching	English. All exchange students must meet the standard language requirements for entry to City, University of London. Generally this is IELTS 6.5 or equivalent (IELTS 7 for Journalism).		
Centre for Language Studies	Exchange students are able to study a foreign language (free of charge) during their time at City. Courses are available in Arabic, French, German, Mandarin and Spanish. More information can be found at: www.city.ac.uk/arts-social-sciences/centre-for-language-studies.		
Credit system	2 UK credits = 1 ECTS.		
Usual work load	It is recommended that students take 4 modules per term for a full course load. Each term-long class passed is worth 15 credits (7.5 ECTS equivalent).
