	<u>Project Title</u>	<i>Putting handles on enzymes? 😊 Development of covalent tags for labelling Bruton's Tyrosine Kinase in living cells</i>
	<u>Project Description</u>	Bruton's Tyrosine Kinase (BTK) is an emerging drug target implicated in leukemia, lymphoma and other malignancies. The aim of our project is to develop a method for placing a molecular "handle" on BTK, which would allow us to tag the enzyme while it remains functional within living cells. Our strategy can be theoretically applicable in many kinases, a large enzyme family involved in numerous cell functions, therefore the labelling of BTK can serve as an initial showcase.
