GAME 1

Before answering some questions, we would like to pair you with other respondents of this survey (real individuals) to measure different reactions to certain situations. However, you will never personally interact with these individuals. In addition, you will never know their identity and they will never know yours. The individuals you have been paired with live in Chile.

We invite you to take some decisions in a situation with "You" and "Individual 2".

Individual 2, like you, received 5 points to participate in the study. You will not be told who this person is either during or after the survey (nor will that person be told anything about you).

Today, you will have the opportunity to send some, all, or none of your 5 points to Individual 2. This person will then keep the points sent to them, if any, and you keep the remainder.

The situation is as follows:

1) You must decide how many points (if any) you will send to Individual 2. Any amount you keep for yourself will be given to you.

2) Whatever amount you send to Individual 2 will be tripled before it is passed on to him/her.

3) Individual 2 then has the option of returning any portion of this tripled amount to you.

For example:

- (a) If you send 1 point, Individual 2 will receive 3 points.
- (b) If you send 5 points, Individual 2 will receive 15 points.
