Job title: One-year postdoctoral researcher assistant (with possible renewal)

Job description

The researcher is expected to work part-time (20 hours a week) assisting the principal researcher (PR) of the project "Abilities and Social Mobility". The primary objective of the project is to research both cross-country and over-time variations in inter-generational social mobility. The project will also examine demographic consequences of social mobility across cohorts.

The researcher is expected to assist the principal investigator conducting empirical analyses with a strong focus on event history modeling and working with complex data sets utilizing advanced STATA applications.

The research should have completed a PhD in Sociology or Demography. Candidates are expected to have strong statistical skills and experience working with complex data related to social mobility and socio-demographic events such as partnering or divorce.

Participation in academic research, projects in the past or co-direction of them, would be highly regarded.

The candidate is expected to start January 1, 2019. The position will have a duration of one year, with possible renewal for 2 or more years, with a monthly gross salary of 900 euros.
