

On **22 September**, **2022**, GRITIM-UPF will organize the <u>Barcelona Intercultural Cities Roundtable</u> within the framework of the research project <u>The International Intercultural Cities Comparative Study</u>, funded by the Erasmus+ programme of the European Union and coordinated by the Swinburne University of Technology (Australia). GRITIM-UPF participates as partner and Ricard Zapata-Barrero is one of the principal investigators.

#### **Outline**

The idea of the 'intercultural city' is gaining traction around the world as a local-level policy approach which promotes cultural and social cohesion by fostering dialogue and interaction across cultural boundaries. The global spread of the intercultural city model, however, has highlighted a wide variation in how the core concept of intercultural interaction is being translated into specific policies and practice.

In a world-first, the International Intercultural Cities Comparative Study has brought together an international team of leading intercultural cities researchers seeking a deeper understanding of the factors shaping these variations and their policy outcomes as a crucial step towards the consolidation of the intercultural city movement.

The study will map convergences and divergences in how the intercultural cities approach has been interpreted and expressed in policies and practices in three regions with very different histories of migration and diversity policy: Europe, North America and Australasia. Also, it will serve as a contribution between the participant groups (CIs, city officials and stakeholders) and to introduce best practices and useful tools in the intercultural cities field. Five cities, all members of the Intercultural cities program, have joined the study: Sabadell (Spain), Sherbrooke (Canada) and Ballarat, Melton and Salisbury (Australia). In particular, the project will examine:

What are the core principles of the intercultural approach?

How have the cities translated intercultural objectives into policies and practices?

What are the factors that have enabled or constrained the successful implementation of intercultural policies and practices?

How has the prior broader policy and governance context influenced the way interculturalism has unfolded in your region and country?



Title: Cosmopolitanism and Mediterranean Cities

Author: Yvan Gastaut, Professor at Université de Nice-Côte d'Azur. Member of the EuroMedMig Steering Committee.

**Abstract**: What place is given to foreigners and migrants in the cities of the Mediterranean basin? At a time of radicalism and withdrawal, rethinking common values on the different shores is becoming an urgent necessity. In this context, the urban space as a place for deciding the place of the "Other" within society appears to be the best possible laboratory for mixing. In order to envisage the future, this article proposes a reflection on the past of Mediterranean cities and their real or supposed cosmopolitanism.









This memory of cities with mixed and variegated populations, linked together by a common culture that is sometimes fantasized, can serve as a reference point for implementing tolerant urban policies capable of moving away from restrictive state management. Between reality and representation, we question the specificity of cosmopolitanism in Mediterranean cities, which, in spite of systems of domination sometimes difficult to support like the colonization, can be.
