

Homologation of your High School Diploma

Once your diploma and academic transcript have been legalized or apostilled you will need to apply for the homologation of your studies in the embassy or consulate of Spain in your home country.

What does “homologation” mean?

The recognition of studies (in Spanish “homologation”) is the procedure by which the Spanish Ministry of Education declares that the studies taken in a foreign country are equivalent to the level of high school in Spain.

To be admitted as an International student, it is necessary that your studies are approved by the Spanish Ministry of Education.

To apply for the homologation you will need to submit the following documents in the embassy or consulate of Spain in your home country:

1. **Original and photocopy of your diploma of secondary education** that has previously been legalized or apostilled and translated into Spanish by a sworn translator. The photocopy will be attested by the embassy or consulate.
2. **Original and photocopy of your academic Transcript** with the subjects and marks obtained during your secondary education that has previously been legalized or apostilled and translated into Spanish by a sworn translator. The photocopy will be attested by the embassy or consulate.
3. **Original and photocopy of your passport.** The photocopy will be attested by the embassy or consulate

After submitting these documents the embassy or consulate should provide you this document:
