The *Highest Argument Agreement* (HAA) project seeks to give an explanatory account of agreement systems that are based not on grammatical functions, but on different prominence hierarchies. Different languages define prominence in different ways, such as they might refer to person-number, case or other semantic or morphosyntactic features. There is, however, interesting evidence that points towards a unified way of treating these phenomena within formal syntax and formal semantics.
