

Approval of the Prize for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project and Best Master's Degree Final Project on Planetary Wellbeing (UPF-ESCI Consortium - IDEC Foundation).

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PREFACE

The object of these regulations is the awarding of the Prizes for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project and Best Master's Degree Final Project on Planetary Wellbeing.

Planetary Wellbeing is understood as an extension of the concept of Planetary Health, including a wider range of subjects related to wellbeing which emphasises the importance of interdisciplinary study between social sciences, humanities, life sciences and technology. Individual and social wellbeing thereby becomes an overall objective for society. Its multidimensional nature includes issues regarding wealth, equity, the environment and other public resources such as health and education.

This prize is jointly offered by Pompeu Fabra University (hereafter UPF), the School of International Trade Consortium (hereafter ESCI), and the Continuing Education Institute Foundation (hereafter FIDEC). An administrative agreement governing these regulations has been signed between the different entities involved for this reason.

Faced with current sustainability challenges, ESCI deems the contribution to knowledge, and stimulating and disseminating research to be of interest. This may help to transform the world by creating a better future and may be used to mitigate climate change, via the UNESCO Chair in Life Cycle and Climate Change.

FIDEC believes knowledge contribution and stimulating research to be of interest in order to transform the environment, society and the planet, by adopting a critical, scientific and socially committed view, via the Barcelona School of Management.

Sole article. To approve the regulations for the Prize in Planetary Wellbeing in the Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project (TFG) and Best Master's Degree Final Project (TFM) categories, as stated in the annex.

ANNEX

REGULATIONS FOR THE PRIZE IN PLANETARY WELLBEING IN THE BEST BACHELOR'S DEGREE FINAL PROJECT (TFG) AND BEST MASTER'S DEGREE FINAL PROJECT (TFM) CATEGORIES

First. Objective

The submissions should be projects related to Planetary Wellbeing which contribute to developing new knowledge in one of the following areas:

- Co-beneficiaries for health and the environment
- Integration of environmental protection in health issues
- Climate change
- Clean energies
- Food production and healthy diets with low environmental impact
- Integrated solutions for land use
- Urban studies
- Global governance
- Global inequalities
- Sustainable development
- Poverty
- Ageing
- Global education
- Global health
- Animal, human and social wellbeing

The Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree Final Projects must be appropriately designed for the area of knowledge in which they have been developed and can be delivered in different formats. They could be theoretical or empirical, for example, using quantitative or qualitative methodologies, or be technical development or artistic projects.

Students can participate individually or in a group, depending on whether the TFG or TFM has been done individually or in a group.

Second. Entry eligibility

- To have submitted a Bachelor's Degree or Master's Degree Final Project to Pompeu Fabra University (hereafter UPF) to the School of International Trade (hereafter ESCI) or to the Barcelona School of Management (hereafter BSM) on any of the Bachelor's or Master's programmes during the academic years indicated in the announcement.
- The project must deal with one or more of the areas listed in the first regulation.

- The project must be original and must have been awarded a minimum grade of 8.5 in the first instance.
- One of the following languages must have been used: Catalan, Spanish or English.
- The project must use non-sexist and non-patriarchal language.

Third. Submission of applications

Applications must be addressed to the Institutional Communication and Promotion Unit (UCPI).

Electronic submissions are preferred. These should be sent by attaching the application form to the electronic General Instance form which can be found on the UPF online office in the list of procedures and processes.

Applications can also be submitted in person at the UPF General Registry together with supporting documentation.

The application form will be available on the UPF's Social Engagement and Sustainable Development website (<https://www.upf.edu/web/responsabilitat-social>).

The project must be submitted in whichever format is most appropriate (PDF, multimedia, plan, prototype, URL link, etc.), always anonymously. Each project must be accompanied by a project summary (maximum 500 words).

Fourth. Prize categories and financial award

- Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project (TFG) category. ESCI's UNESCO Chair in Life Cycle and Climate Change and UPF Prize for Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project on issues of Planetary Wellbeing.

One first prize and two second prizes will be awarded and an honorary diploma will be presented during a public award ceremony.

The financial awards for the prizes in this category are provided by ESCI and UPF, and the amount of prize money will be decided each year the competition is held.

- Best Master's Degree Final Project (TFM) category. BSM and ESCI's UNESCO Chair in Life Cycle and Climate Change Prize for Best Master's Degree Final Project on issues of Planetary Wellbeing.

One first prize and two second prizes will be awarded and an honorary diploma will be presented during a public award ceremony.

The financial awards for the prizes in this category are provided by BSM and ESCI, and the amount of prize money will be decided each year the competition is held.

Fifth. Announcement

An announcement will be published each year for each Prize category, and the convening body will be the rector.

The announcement will appear on UPF, ESCI and BSM's normal communication channels and will contain the following minimum information:

- Financial award
- Application period
- Application form

Sixth. Management

The Institutional Communication and Promotion Unit (UCPI) will carry out official proceedings, those which are subject to the corresponding provisions of Law 39/2015 of 1st October, on the common administrative procedures of all public administrations.

Seventh. Assessment Committee

The Assessment Committee will be made up of the following members:

1) Best Bachelor's Degree Final Project (TFG) category

- Vice-rector of Social Engagement and Sustainable Development at UPF, or a delegated representative.
- Head of the Planetary Wellbeing Study Centre, or a delegated representative.
- A member of teaching staff with expertise in Planetary Wellbeing or Sustainability Studies at ESCI, appointed by the UPF rector on behalf of ESCI.
- A specialist in the field of Social Responsibility from UPF, who will act as secretary, appointed by the UPF rector on behalf of UCPI.

2) Best Master's Degree Final Project category

- Vice-rector of Social Engagement and Sustainable Development at UPF, or a delegated representative.
- A member of teaching staff with expertise in Planetary Wellbeing or Sustainability Studies at ESCI, appointed by the UPF rector on behalf of ESCI.
- A member of teaching staff with expertise in Planetary Wellbeing or Sustainability Studies at BSM, appointed by the UPF rector on behalf of BSM.

- A specialist in the field of Social Responsibility from UPF, who will act as secretary, appointed by the UPF rector on behalf of UCPI.

The Assessment Committee's functions are to evaluate the submitted applications and present their chosen candidate/s to the governing body for this to be resolved.

The Committee can request advice or support from other experts in order to evaluate the projects submitted.

Eighth. Evaluation criteria

The Assessment Committee will adhere to the following criteria:

- Topic relevance and originality of development (25 points)
- Theoretical framework used (25 points)
- Coherence and methodological rigour (25 points)
- Results, conclusions and advancements contributing to the field of Planetary Wellbeing studies (25 points)

The minimum score required to receive this Prize is 60 points. The Prize may not be awarded if there are no eligible applications.

Ninth. Resolution and announcement of results

The body responsible for resolving the competition is the rector, who will decide the prizewinner/s each academic year during the month of October.

Participants will be advised by email about the resolution at the same time this is published on the UPF website.

Tenth. Obligations of the winning person or team

- If successful, to promise to do a presentation about the project at a public award ceremony during the academic year following receipt of the Prize.
- To publish the complete text of the project at the University repository immediately (without any temporary restrictions), with open access.

Eleventh. Personal Data Protection

The purpose of personal data collection throughout this competition is its management for the awarding of prizes, which will be done in accordance with (EU) General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 and with Organic Law 3/2018 of 5th December, on personal data protection and the guaranteeing of digital rights. Pompeu Fabra University is likewise responsible for processing this data. Plaça de la Mercè, 12. 08002 Barcelona. Those concerned may

Personal data will be kept for the duration of the competition and for as long as legal liabilities may apply. Nevertheless, information about the beneficiaries will be shown on the University website in accordance with the current transparency legislation, and may also appear in publicity material related to the winning projects.

Legitimation: Public interest mission (in accordance with Article 41 of Organic Law 6/2001 about universities).

Personal data will be processed by Pompeu Fabra University and will not be given to third parties, except in cases provided for by law.

Participants in the competition may exercise their rights of access, rectification, objection, deletion, restriction and portability, following the procedures described at www.upf.edu/web/proteccio-dades/drets.

Objection to the processing of personal data, to the extent which this may be incompatible with managing competition applications, constitutes withdrawal from the competition or from receiving the award.

Those concerned may contact the University data protection officer (dpd@upf.edu) if they believe that their rights have not been duly respected. In the event that they are not satisfied, they are entitled to lodge a complaint with the Catalan Data Protection Authority (<http://apdcat.gencat.cat>).
