LORENZO DELGADO GOMEZ-ESCALONILLA is a Senior Researcher at the National Research Council of Spain (CSIC). Doctorate in Contemporary History at Complutense University of Madrid. Research Fellow at the Centre d'Histoire des Relations Internationales Contemporaines, Université Paris I-Sorbonne. Researcher Participant at the International Visitor Program of the United States. He is also Research Fellow at the Institute of Science and Technology Studies (University of Salamanca).
