

Arete Adamopoulou is Professor of Art History at the University of Ioannina, Greece. She has studied archaeology at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (BA and PhD) and Art History and Theory at the University of Essex, UK (MA). She has a long teaching experience in Greek Universities. Prior to her current position, she was an Art Historian at the Ephorate of Modern Monuments, Thessaloniki, Greece and an Art Historian-Curator at the Contemporary Art Center of Thessaloniki, Greece. She has authored books (among others: *Post-war Greek Art. Visual Interventions in Space*, University Studio Press, 2000. *Art and Cold War Diplomacy. International Art Exhibitions in Athens, 1950-1967*, University Studio Press, 2019) and edited volumes on art history in Greek. She publishes mainly in Greek and English. She has participated in research programs on Greek art, and she is now supervising one on public monuments for World War II in Greece. Her research focuses on national identity and art, disciplinary history, Cold War exhibitions, contemporary art, and the art market.
